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Current Practise and Strengths

- Good provision of clubs and after school activities for children.
- Curriculum provision is good. Children are taught a range of sports across the key areas of PE by qualified sports coaches and teachers.
- We have good links with our Trust schools and are able to use their facilities/young leaders where possible.
- Children with SEN are included in all provision and their needs are met.

Outcomes

- Developed confidence amongst staff in the teaching of PE.
- Creation of a long term curriculum map is devised to ensure that all classes are participating in a range of PE activities throughout the school.
- Disadvantaged children given opportunities to access sporting clubs.
- A variety of sporting clubs offered after school, thus improving and developing their skills and knowledge, including Football, Basketball, Gymnastics and Tennis.
- The improvement and development in pupils' teamwork, leadership and communication skills through PE.
